

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

The report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education provides a snapshot of the academic achievement and overall growth of students attending Jordan Valley School District.

During the 2014-2015 school year, ODE began using the Smarter Balanced test for both reading and math. The new tests are more complex with critical thinking skills, problem solving, writing, and are aligned to the new Common Core State Standards. For this reason, scores look lower this year across the state of Oregon. ODE expects these results to improve over time.

The results indicate that when compared to schools of similar size and demographics we are achieving at or above the norm.

Key academic highlights:

- 86.7% pass rate for high school English Language Arts on the Smarter Balanced test.
- 12% above the state average for high school Math students tested on the Smarter Balanced test.
- 13% above the state graduation rate.

We've chosen to focus our resources on solidifying our student's knowledge of the new Common Core State Standards (CCSS), which reinforce literacy across content areas and rigor in mathematics. You can help by monitoring your student's homework, attending parent-teacher conferences, or even volunteering.

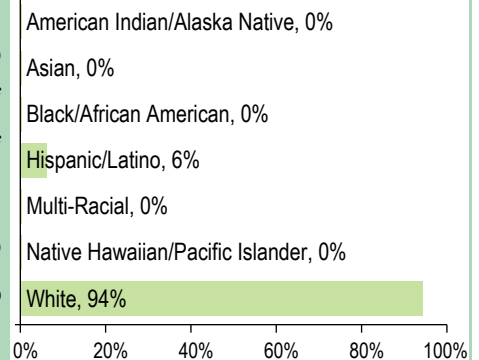

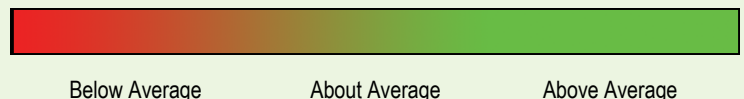
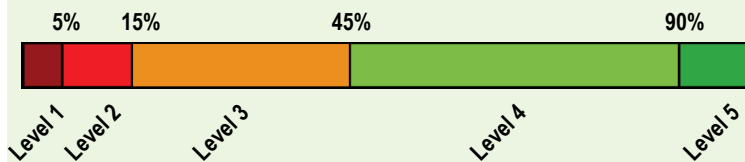
